No public expressions were made.

Chad Collom informed the board that sewer had backed up in his crawl space back in February and requested the Village reimburse him for the bill to ServePro. Kevin asked if his sewer was a closed system. Chad stated there was a broken fitting that allowed the sewer to come into his crawl space. Tim stated when he looked at the crawl space, there was an open pipe to the sewer. Mayor Schmink directed the Clerk to make a copy of the ServePro bill and informed Chad that the board would discuss this issue and get back to you.

Jeff Taylor addressed the board with his concerns about the IGA parking lot. Jeff stated that kids were racing in and out, were loud, and was concerned about the Village's liability with the kids racing in and out. Mayor Schmink asked if Jeff had called 911. Jeff stated that he has many times and the police come and the kids leave but then show back up about thirty minutes later. Mayor Schmink directed Jeff to continue to call the police if there are issues. Jeff also asked about the Village curfew. Fred stated that there is a state curfew of 11 PM until 6 AM for Sunday through Thursday and then midnight to 6 AM on Friday and Saturday.

Jim Rogers, President of the Catlin Library board stated that the Library District was looking to add a gravel parking lot to the North of the current library. He said it would add ten parking spots and would be around twenty-four feet by one hundred feet. Kevin stated that Carl and himself had looked into the utility easements that are between the current library parking lot and that lot and the sewer and storm sewer were buried sufficiently enough to allow a gravel parking lot, but a permanent surface would not be allowed due to that easement. Jim said there was a man-hole in that lot. Kevin stated that the Village would most likely require the library to pour concrete around that man-hole.

A motion was made by Kevin, seconded by Jerry to approve Ordinance 744: An Ordinance amending the Village of Catlin Ordinance: Ordinance Violation for underage smoking, including electronic cigarettes.

Chief Beddow introduced a letter from the Salt Fork Superintendent, Phil Cox:

Chief Beddow,

The purpose of this letter is to extend an invitation to the Catlin Police Department to have its police officers visit and patrol the hallways of the Salt Fork South Elementary School and Salt Fork Junior High throughout the school year. My hope is that your officers will assist us in providing a police presence in these schools and build a positive rapport with our students. It is also my request that the Catlin Police Department be available to answer calls for assistance at Salt Fork South Elementary School and Salt Fork Junior High should the Vermilion County Sheriff's Department not be readily available. We appreciate your past presence at the Salt Fork North Elementary School and Salt Fork High School and feel your presence at our South Campus schools would be of value.

Mayor Schmink stated he didn't have a problem with our officers visiting the South Campus. Kevin stated that this was to protect our kids and he also did not see a problem with this. Fred stated that Catlin residents pay taxes for our officers to be in Catlin, not fifteen miles away and did not approve. Chief Beddow stated that Catlin residents have children that go to the South Campus and all the kids that go to the South Campus will be coming to the North Campus and this is great way to build a rapport with all the students. A motion was made by Kevin, seconded by Jerry to approve the Catlin Police to patrol the South Campus for the first semester of the 2018 school year and to report back to the Mayor with any concerns.

Commissioner Schmit:

 Mayor Schmink informed the board that three shade structures will be ordered for the Splash Park. Mayor Schmink asked for Village employees be prepared to have these installed.

Commissioner Kirk:

- The Street Department spent a lot of time getting the Village ready for the Strawberry Festival.
- Several projects for this summer are planned, including the catch basin on Wayne Drive, five or six asphalt and concrete patch work that will need to be done to repair where streets were torn up due to water main breaks.

- Mayor Schmink asked for the Street Department to look at the Silvestro house where part of the concrete was torn up from a water main break. Carl said that the concrete was on the Village side but he would look into it.
- A motion was made by Kevin, seconded by Jerry to hire Evan Baird for summer seasonal help at \$9.25 per hour.

Commissioner Reddy:

- Fred informed the board that sewer line at 800 S. Sandusky would be jetted out later this week.
- Village engineers would be at the wastewater plant tomorrow to help the Water and Sewer department employees run the new dri prime pump.
- Mayor Schmink suggested that the board take the two letters to the Catlin residents written regarding Aqua's increase of 25% and review them and be ready to discuss these at the next meeting.

Shelley informed the board that she was approached regarding an opportunity for a free four drawer fire safe cabinet. The cabinet weighs around four to five hundred pounds and we would be required to move it to the Village. Shelley stated that all Ordinances, agendas, and minutes are required by law to be saved forever. The four-drawer cabinet fire safe that the Village has now is full. These cabinets range in price from \$3,000 to \$5,000 so being able to obtain one at no cost is a great deal. Kevin asked for Shelley to gather some more information, so the Village could get the moving scheduled.

Mayor Schmink stated that he would be attending the Township meeting to request an Intergovernmental Agreement between the Village and Township regarding the land between the Township maintenance building and the Village maintenance building to have the new police garage built. Kevin suggested the Clerk find the previous Intergovernmental Agreement between the Township and the Village for the sand shed and use that as a guide.
