A motion was made by Kevin and seconded by Fred to approve and accept Ordinance 714 for the 2013 Prevailing Wage Act Ordinance.

Mark and Kelly Richardson addressed the board with images of metal garage types that they were requesting permission to build in replacement of the current garage. Kevin informed Mark and Kelly that the exact measurements and details need to be submitted prior to a permit being issued. Kelly requested that they would be given permission to have a garage with metal siding. This would not be an issue per the board if the international building code was met and the current building ordinance were met. Kelly is going to submit the exact details of the garage to Commissioner Schmink.

The swimming pool ordinance was last updated in 1999. Questions regarding the inflatable or temporary pools have risen. Does the current \$10.00 permit required for permanent pools cover the temporary pools that are constructed and dismantled each year? Butch suggested that one permit should cover the life of the pool. Kevin stated that pools should be inspected. Shelley was instructed to contact the village attorney to have an amendment to the swimming pool ordinance with clarification that the \$10.00 permit would cover the life of the temporary pools. A new permit would not have to be obtained each year.

Mayor Robinson informed the board that the police Expedition had 7 screws in the tires. In the past, the police cars were stored in the fire station. One tire was replaced today. The other three will need to be replaced. The screws that were found in the tires are short ones. The Mayor stated that these are not screws you would normally find on the streets. The screws had to be placed directly under the tire.

Commissioner Voorhees:

- Lights were changed in the board room in the Village Hall. Tim informed the board that the police station would have their light replaced soon.
- Tad informed the board that the generator was serviced.

Carl Barnes informed the board that three or four post on the pavilion at Camp Swampy, also known as Butler Branch is rotten. The gable sheeting also needs replaced. Kevin suggested that we use steel post. It was also discussed that if it was worth trying to save. The pavilion was originally built on a grant of \$70,000. It stated that within a certain amount of years, if the pavilion was torn down or certain changes were made, the grant would have to be paid back. It was unknown how many years were stipulated in the grant. A request was made to have Shelley find the file on the grant and bring the information to the next board meeting.

#### Commissioner Kirk:

- Another tire lost its treading on the maintained truck and will have to be replaced. The truck is 18 years old and besides the tires, is in great shape.
- The removal of the tree stumps between the funeral home and the photographers' is almost complete. Fred inquired if the village was creating a barrier between the businesses. Kevin stated that per the agreement between the owners and the village, the village would maintain the ally but any construction of a barrier would be at the owners' expense.
- Cold patches have been placed on the streets.
- Cash Cook informed the board that the lights at the park will be taken care of.
- Tim informed the board that the information requested by Andy for the grant for the new water line on Merrill has been sent. Just awaiting a response.

# Commissioner Reddy:

• Tim has contacted Simmons Tree Service to get an estimate on the large tree at the pump station that needs to be removed.
