- Carl, Kevin, and the Village Engineering Firm, Fehr-Graham will be meeting on Monday to discuss the up-coming street project for the Motor Fuel Tax Account.
- Salt and sand supply is still in good shape.
- Kevin stated that he had received one bid on replacing the heating at the maintenance shop but wanted to wait until he received at least one more.
- Kevin and Carl had started working on a list of streets to be included in the snow routes for next year. Kevin stated that this will need to be written up into Ordinance form and it would be best to have this done by next fall so the residents know what is expected. Jim stated that the accident occurred when there was not snow on the streets, but rather ice. Jim also stated that Meadowlane is one of the wider streets within the Village. Kevin stated that if snow routes were used, the residents can work with the Village to try to eliminate some of the problems.

Commissioner Reddy:

- Fred informed the board that a new motor must be purchased for the wastewater plant.
- An electrical audit was completed today at the wastewater plant. Matt Johnson, from Fehr Graham was here with the auditors. There is grant money available for the wastewater facility plan if the wastewater plant becomes more energy efficient. Shelley also stated that due to lack of insulation within the wastewater

Ron Garland asked to address the board regarding the south water tower. Ron stated that the pipe leading off the water tower has been buried, as he had previously requested, but he believed the clamps being used were not sufficient. Mayor Schmink stated that Commissioner Reddy and Water Supervisor, Tim McFadden would come down next week to look at his concerns.
