Commissioner Kirk:

- Matt Johnson, engineer for Fehr Graham updated the board on the recent bid opening for the wastewater facility rebuild. Matt explained that the project budget figure of \$8,636,000.00 was announced prior to opening the bids and then the bids were publicly opened and read. Five bids were received:
 - o Schomburg & Schomburg Construction: \$8,890,000.00
 - o Curry Construction: \$9,137,463.00
 - o River City Construction LLC: \$9,687,000.00
 - o Thieneman Construction: \$9,809,000.00
 - o Leander Construction: \$10,235,000.00

Fehr Graham recommends that the base bid without bid deductions be accepted. The apparent low base bid is larger than the project construction budget as previously approved by USDA, therefore, a revised budget must be approved and an additional \$500,000.00 in funding will be required from USDA.

The impact on the wastewater rate if USDA comes back with no grant funds and the entire \$500,000.00 is loan, would be 6%, or an additional \$3.00 more than what was previously discussed. After all the paperwork for USDA is complete and the loan closes, then the pre-construction meeting would take place. A notice to proceed would be issued and construction could begin around mid to late November.

Kevin stated that he has thought about this project and this vote a lot over the last two weeks. After twenty years on the board, he stated this might be the largest vote he has ever cast but after reflection, it was not. The vote to begin the process and hire Fehr Graham was the largest vote and there was no going back now. While the rate increase is not easy to swallow, it is necessary. Mayor Schmink stated that he agreed, and it had to be done. Wanda had the same sentiments and said the project had to move forward.
