Brenda stated that the Village has been a business donor but would love for the Village to become a corporate sponsor at \$1,000.00. Kevin asked Doug where he saw the trend of COVID-19 going for the County. Doug stated that unfortunately, Vermilion County is still in the first wave of the virus. Doug further stated that the Salt Fork Administration has done a great job of trying to contain the COVID-19 and the level of cooperation between the Vermilion County Health Department and the school district has been great. Wanda stated that last week, she authorized the Village park to be closed down to show support for the school district and to try to keep the infection rate low.

- The board discussed trimming of the trees along the east side of N. Paris St. The board decided to call Ted Taylor to see if he would trim them this fall and the Village would pick up the limbs and have them disposed.

Commissioner Kirk:

• Kevin asked Tim McFadden to give an update on the wastewater plant. Tim stated the new sewer lines, air lines and water lines were all being ran at the same time. With new fire hydrants that are being installed, the Village had to submit a list of hoses and fittings that it would need. Tim stated that he worked with Tad Beddow to submit a correct list of what would be needed and Tim thanked Tad for his help and expertise.

Mayor Schmink:

Mayor Schmink informed the board that David Wesner, the attorney at Acton & Snyder
that has been handling our current litigation and the legal aspects of the wastewater plant
rebuild has left Acton & Snyder and is now at Evans, Froehlich, Beth & Chamley.
Currently, our Village Attorney of record is Jared Trigg with Acton & Snyder. Wanda
stated the Village needs an attorney with a strong holding on municipal law.

Kevin stated that the Village has a long-standing relationship with Acton & Snyder that spans close to fifty years and he believes we should talk to the partners of the firm prior to making a decision. A motion was made by Wanda, seconded by Jerry to hire David Wesner, of Evans, Froehlich, Beth & Chamley to be the Village Attorney of record.
