#### Commissioner Kirk:

- Kevin asked Tim McFadden to give an update on the wastewater plant. Tim stated that rebuild was moving along but progress seems to be slowing down as the new equipment moves online. Tim stated the road to the wastewater plant is getting pretty rough. The heavy machinery and traffic from the rebuild is taking a toll. Kevin stated that at the beginning of the project, the Village knew that the road may be torn up and pictures were taken to show previous condition to current condition and if there were contingency money left from the USDA, the Village could apply to the USDA to use those funds on repairing the road. Kevin asked Tim and Shelley to discuss with the engineers and USDA at the next progress meeting.
- Kevin stated that the new meters were being installed and additional meters have been ordered to be installed this summer. The goal is to have all the new meters installed within this fiscal year.

# Mayor Schmink:

### Chief Beddow:

- Tad informed the board the new patrol car has arrived.
- There are a couple of properties in town that the street department may have to mow and have liens placed upon them.
- The final count on the search warrant that was executed before the last meeting is 51 cats and an additional 19 kittens have been born since the animal control seized the animals, with an additional two still pregnant. Three ordinance violations were issued to the property owners.
- Tad also informed the board that Dwayne High and Chuck Johnson will both be leaving the Catlin Police Department as of June 1. Tad is looking for replacements but all Villages in the area are looking to hire. Tad stated that the board may have to look at increasing pay for the part-time officers to make sure we can cover shifts.

• Tad stated that the police have noticed increase trespassing at the old elevator but when the police call Bunge, they are over here quick to correct any problems. Tad also stated that they had to call the Township to get some windows boarded up and the Township did state they were still looking to get demolition bids for their property.
