## Public Expressions:

Charlotte Mello and Christian Koen were present from Liberty Energy and just wanted to know if anyone had any questions for them and that she will provide the village clerk with contact information after the meeting if anyone has any questions for them.

Doug Toole & Brenda Adams were present on behalf of Keep Vermilion County Beautiful and the waste-tire collection program. Doug stated that the fall electronics had approximately 250 vehicles with an average collection of 2 TV's, and ½ of a monitor per vehicle. They are planning the do this program again in the spring and next fall. Doug explained that the EPA has a used tire collection program where the village can take used tires and the EPA has a contractor that collects them.

Brenda spoke regarding the village's membership in Keep Vermilion County Clean and what the benefits of the program are. Their next meeting will be at the Slotted Spoon on November 21, at 5pm. Brenda spoke about the eligibility for the beatification grant applications that should be available by early spring. Wanda asked what the amount of time is that the grant money would need to be used by after it is granted, wrapping up end of November or early December. The grant is per calendar year and can be applied for year after year. Brenda listed the levels of membership for businesses as \$150 and up and corporate level at \$1000 and up. They also offer a residential beautification grant for homeowners and the fee is \$50. Wanda had asked about a recycling program and at this time there is not one in vermilion county.

A motion was made by Wanda, seconded by Kevin to give \$500.00 to Keep Vermilion County Beautiful for the business membership.

• Jerry reported that they are getting ready for winter. The new plow is on the truck and ready to go.

### Commissioner Kirk:

- Kevin noted that there are some issues with some lab equipment and found out there was some we didn't need and some that was incorrect. Engineers are working on getting right stuff coming and trying to return old equipment. Engineers are not responding well to why we have wrong equipment.
- Safety concerns are being worked on for compliance.

### Mayor Schmink:

Mayor presented a proposal from Fehr Graham for 10ft of sidewalk wide enough for golf carts to be able to pass going to Dollar General. Out of pocket would be looking at one million dollars – will be looking into to grants to file for 2024. Questions were made regarding land/bridge needs. Mayor will look into this more with engineers and will come back with more data and then will present it again.

#### Chief of Police

- Tad wanted to thank the board for the Thanksgiving gift cards for the police department that the officers appreciated it.
- Tad advised that the lights are working again at the park, and they plan to keep the park lit up.
